What is a HYPERTEXT ?

A hypertext is a linked document which enables the user to jump from one piece of information to another by simply clicking a mouse button. The information could be heterogeneous (texts, pictures, graphics, sounds, etc.).

What is INTERNET ?

It is a WorldWide network of computer networks currently used by more than 30 million people. It provides access to a large number of services: electronic mail, file transfer, information **browsing** and retrieval (e.g. via **WWW**), social communication, news gathering, business...
Sooner or later, nearly all of us are going to get involved with it !

What is WWW ?

The World Wide Web (WWW) provides an **hypertext-based** interface to **Internet**.

To access and navigate WWW you need a **browser**.

To add your own information to WWW you need a **server**.

What is a WWW Browser ?

A WWW Browser is a program that provides access to **WWW**.

Behind a friendly interface, complex operations such as connection to hosts and file transfer, are carried out. Popular browsers are: Netscape, NCSA, Mosaic and Windows95 Explorer.

What is a WWW Server ?

A WWW Server is a program which makes your own information available on **WWW**.

It runs on a Computer directly connected to **Internet**.

Your information (texts, pictures, sounds, databases, etc.) need to be written in a "language" the Server can understand (ex. HTML).

What can you do with them ?

- * Information exchange
- * Publishing
- * Data-base retrieval
- * Educational opportunities
- * Commercial expansion
- * Political awareness
